


Seventh Sunday of Easter 29th May including 5th/12th June

We are on our way to Pentecost! The Holy Spirit is definitely coming in our direction! At Pentecost we celebrate the Birth of the Church with the outpouring of the Spirit. Each one of us is renewed in faith and love. The Spirit sends us out with a message and holds us together as the Lord's Family. The experience is gentle as in the Gospel passage from John 20; it is dramatic as the account from the Acts of the Apostles portrays. In the run-up to the Fiftieth Day, the Church prays with all her heart for the Spirit to come; Christians model themselves on Our Lady gathered with the Apostles in the Upper Room. This year our world has been traumatically affected by the war in Ukraine, by the recent tragedy in the US School, by the poverty facing so many and by the aftermath of pandemic and attempts to rebuild lives. We need hope. We long for peace in its many guises. Reconciliation and the just sharing of resources could make such a difference. Let us ask the Spirit to come!

This year we are caught up in Platinum Jubilee Celebrations! In the midst of all that unfolds is Her Majesty the Queen who has committed herself to the dedicated service of the people entrusted to her. The conviction of her calling and the energy she has expended over seven decades have left a mark on history. She is a woman of Faith and she is proud to call herself a Christian. As we gaze at photographs of the newly crowned Monarch of 1953 and then compare them with the image with the 96-year-old widowed Queen, we see a life which has changed, developed and been opened up to many new ways. The world, society, technology, nations and attitudes are certainly way beyond anything one might have imagined in 1952 when the Queen acceded to the Throne! May God bless Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. May the celebrations over the coming days be memorable and bring the country together.

ONE CANONICAL PARISH Fr. Norbert writes: "I have received a response from the Cardinal in regard to the request to become one Canonical Parish. In these past weeks, some parishioners have approached me worried that there would be only one church left in WGC. There have been other concerns to do with finances. I have been waiting for the Cardinal to write to confirm what is the plan for the future. The Cardinal states explicitly that 'a formal consultation process should now begin to inform the decision-making on the possible merging of the three parishes into one new parish whilst continuing to retain all three churches for worship.' Consultation will need to be made with the neighbouring Deanery Parishes, Schools and Religious Communities. More important will be the discussions we hold here in our three parishes with you, the people. This will be formal and will require the involvement and views of a sizeable number of people (at least 50). The final decision is the Cardinal's and has to be ratified by the Council of Priests to satisfy Canon (Church) Law. Obviously, the Cardinal is especially interested in the views of parishioners and of me, as your Parish Priest. By the time we have our next newsletter, I hope to be able to outline the process. When I was appointed to the three parishes as Parish Priest in 2008, Bishop George Stack, then Auxiliary Bishop looking after Hertfordshire, made it very clear to me that his vision was of one parish with three churches - a united Catholic Community to make an impact on our town. He told me that there was no blueprint and that I would have to find a way of doing so. I have tried to do this for the past 14 years. Our way of operating in WGC is quite unique in the Diocese and is a sign of how faith, cooperation with a measure of fun can bring great life to a community and help us face challenges such as the time of pandemic and lockdown. Please keep this intention in your prayers and be ready to make your contribution to deliberations"BISHOPS' CONFERENCE STATEMENT Please have a look at the statement from the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales which is on our website. From Pentecost on 5th June, they are urging Catholics to return to the obligation of attending Sunday Mass. They recognise that for the elderly and vulnerable this might be more difficult. Please encourage people to come back. Let's give them a warm welcome and ensure they feel safe.

POPE FRANCIS on Tuesday 31st May at 5pm UK time will be reciting the Rosary in front of the statue of Our Lady Queen of Peace in the Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore in Rome. In doing so, 'he wishes to offer a sign of hope to the world, suffering through the conflict in Ukraine, and profoundly wounded through the violence of so many other theatres of war.' The Cardinal wants us to be aware of this initiative at the end of May and to join the Holy Father as far as is possible. NEW PARISH HALL Much hard work is going on behind the scenes to help us move forward towards a formal opening of our new Parish Hall - Trinity Hall. The key issue is how it will be managed and the system of bookings. So many individuals, families and groups are ready to sign up. Thank you for your patience!

BARBECUE organised by the African Community for the people of our three parishes and beyond will take place on Sunday 3rd July. Hopefully the new hall will be in use and so this will be regarded as a 'test event' when we can monitor safety and other issues arising from a big event.

THE PARADOX OF ABUNDANCE Over 800 million people go hungry each day. Yet the world produces over 4 billion tonnes of food and we only need 3.7 billion tonnes to feed everyone. From all this food produced, a third is wasted. St John Paul II called this 'the paradox of abundance.' Clearly the currently global food system is not working. But as Pope Francis said, "Each of us has a role to play in transforming food systems for the benefit of people and the planet." Let's respond to his call!
