I have just watched Pope Francis leading the world in prayer asking God our Father to save us from the perils we face. What a great sense of solidarity! What a powerful moment focused on Jesus Christ! What faith and trust in the midst of the storms we face!

Sunday's Gospel reading from St. John takes us to another group of people - the friends and family of Lazarus who has died. They gather in sadness and confusion at the loss of a young one, asking the question we so often pose 'Why?' People wonder where Jesus is in the midst of such pain. He loved the family of Martha, Mary and Lazarus in Bethany; Lazarus was his friend. When Jesus hears that Lazarus is sick, he tells his disciples that 'this sickness will end...in God's glory and through it the Son of God will be glorified.' These are enigmatic words. They test us to the core of our being when our lives are shattered and we witness so much suffering and feel utterly helpless. Jesus himself experienced the Cross of Suffering and Death; he has come to the Triumph of Resurrection. This is not an easy answer but the Lord asks us to walk with him as he carries his Cross which includes our crosses. He invites us to be patient as we long for the Light of Resurrection to shine out. He will not let us down!

As we start another week which will take us to Holy Week, remember the many ways we can be united with others in loving trust. Let us constantly allow the Lord Jesus to remind us that he is so intimately close to us. Let us pray for the countless people bringing support and care in vital ways. Let us not give up. Fr. Tony and I are offering Mass each day for you and for our world. Let us support one another through this crisis and look forward to the day when we will be able to rejoice.
