

HOLY FAMILY

Corpus Christi 14th June 2020

The Eucharist is such a wonderful gift left to us by the Lord at the Last Supper - as a Memorial of his Passion, Death and Resurrection - and handed down from generation to generation until our own day. Mass has been celebrated in people's homes, in magnificent cathedrals, out in the open air and hidden away in times of persecution. There have been periods in the Church's history when very few received Holy Communion, when the fast in preparation to receive was from midnight, when only Confession first was the practice. So, a variety of experiences, languages, traditions and disciplines. The fashions of liturgical vestments have altered over the centuries too!

Today on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, we gather for Mass in a time of lockdown and pandemic, a unique moment in history in which we are living. What do you *miss* about not being able to attend Mass in church? This list is not exhaustive but have you thought about: receiving Holy Communion, being in the church building, meeting your friends, exercising ministries, having an hour of quiet for yourself as you prepare for another week? There are so many significant points of life celebrated in the context of the Eucharist: Funerals, Weddings, Confirmations, First Holy Communions, Anniversaries etc. At the heart of the Eucharist is Christ's Presence in Word and in Sacrament, in the Community which is his Body and in his minister, the Priest; all are caught up in the dynamic love of his perfect Sacrifice on Calvary offered to the Father for the salvation of the world. We have our gaze fixed on heaven and heaven is joined to us on earth. How marvellous! The Church invites us especially to proclaim that the Bread and Wine consecrated in the Mass are truly the Body and Blood of Christ, that this was the Lord's intention when he said 'This is my body...this is my Blood...do this in memory of me.'

In this time of crisis, much has changed and we will be left with a fresh approach to the Mass, perhaps for a very long time: no Sign of Peace, Communion in the hand only, no drinking from the Chalice AND distancing from one another. Whenever we return to public Mass it will feel very different and there will be plenty to ponder. Try and reflect on the *positive* dimensions of the present moment. For now you are still connected to the Mass through the internet. You are called on to feel Christ's presence but through a 'modern' means of communication. I know some of you are all over the world for Mass and maybe a few Masses in one day! Others have told me that the streamed Masses on YouTube and Facebook help them feel connected to the rest of our community even though they can't see one another.

Let us continue to pray for our world and the many individuals desperate for help and encouragement. Let us thank God for the Eucharist, albeit not quite as we have known it in the past. Let us be grateful that we have opportunities to be together as we are now able. Fr. Tony and I wish you every blessing. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

MASS ON RADIO

If you are aware of someone not on the internet who would like to follow Mass, RTE Radio broadcasts Mass on 252 Longwave. For those who have a digital radio, Radio Maria broadcasts in London on DAB+ and in the Cambridge area on DAB.

On Sunday 14th June, the Sunday Worship Programme, which airs at 8.10am on BBC Radio 4, will broadcast Mass celebrated by the Cardinal in Westminster Cathedral. OPENING OF CHURCHES In response to the permission for churches to open for private prayer, we are going to take things gently. For the next two weeks our churches will be open as follows:

St. Bonaventure: Tuesday 16th June 9.30 - 10.30am and Tuesday 23rd June 9.30 - 10.30am.

Holy Family: Thursday 18th June 9.30 - 10.30am and Thursday 25th June 9.30 - 10.30am.

Our Lady's: Friday 19th June 7 - 8pm and Friday 26th June 7 - 8pm

To meet the regulations, there will only be *quiet, private prayer* allowed. There will be stewards at the entrance of the church and at the exit which will be a different door so that movement is only in one direction. Hands will be sanitised on entry and departure. A further steward will be in the church to give support. We have created distancing by blocking off and bunching up benches. This inevitably has reduced the number of places available. In **St. Bonaventure's only 8 individuals, couples or families** can be in at once, in **Holy Family this will be 17** and in **Our Lady's 20**. If the church is full, then people will have to wait outside. After the particular hour of prayer the benches will be sanitised and the church prepared for the following week. After two weeks we will review how the system has proceeded. There will NOT be the opportunity for Confession in the church. Also toilets will remain closed.

Our aim is to make sure that at all times people are safe, distanced and able with confidence to pray. If you are unwell, a vulnerable person, shielding, or at risk because of your age, it is worth considering whether it would be the right thing to come to church. At each time of opening, Fr. Tony and Fr. Norbert intend to be there.

We do not know when public celebrations of Mass will be allowed. Streamed Masses will definitely continue. Thank you for your prayers and your patience!
