

4th Sunday of the Year 29th January

'Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill.' These are the opening words of Chapter 5 of St. Matthew's Gospel as we embark on the Sermon on the Mount. If you saw hordes of people, what would you do? Run away from them? Head towards them? Wonder what to do? Christ moves up, he takes his place in a seated position and is joined by his disciples. Again, did the disciples go up immediately? Did they wonder what was going to happen next? Were they worried about crowd control - health and safety?!!! Crucially the Lord begins to speak and his words form teaching to shape the identity of the disciples and put the masses in touch with the Kingdom of heaven. The Lord talks and talks; he challenges and he affirms. Christ emerges as the new Moses who will save God's people and put in their hands lifegiving teaching. Even though the multitude seems to be great, the Lord has a word for each individual.

As we gather today for Mass, the Word of God entrusted to us speaks of Blessings and Happiness - the essence of belonging to the Kingdom of heaven. Jesus through God's grace can turn things around so that what is negative, burdensome or painful can be transformed into a hope-filled experience suffused with God's love. Does that make you feel any better when the weather is cold and miserable, or when you wonder about the Ukraine and the next stages in the conflict? As the financial crisis looms and times are desperate for so many, how does receiving this Word of Christ impact on you? Moses was alone with God up the mountain and when he finally emerged with the tablets of stone inscribed with the Law, he found the people worshipping the Golden Calf which they had created for themselves. It can be very easy to give ourselves over to idols to compensate for uncertainty. In the case of Jesus Christ, he is the one who reveals the Law in person and so we hold onto him; he is God's personal revelation to us and so we look to him. He suffered hugely for the human race and so we discover through him the gift of salvation. Halfway through this Sermon, we will enter Lent and journey with Jesus to the Cross and Resurrection. Let's enjoy these few weeks of the Sermon on the Mount focussed on Jesus and surrounded by so many other people!

In 10 days or so on Tuesday 7th February, my installation as Canon of Westminster Cathedral will take place. Everyone is welcome and there are no tickets required. Vespers (at 4.45pm) is the Evening Prayer of the Church made up of psalms, Scripture and intercessions. I will be called up and the Cardinal's letter read out. I will make a Profession of Faith with my hand on the Book of Gospels. I will be vested as Canon and then taken to my seat (stall) - hence installation. Then there will be Mass. Afterwards I plan to greet those who have come on the piazza of the Cathedral - hopefully it will be dry! My role is to be a consultor, to represent the Diocese and especially to be a voice for others. I am so proud to be your Parish Priest and this honour recognises our relationship as priest and people and the powerful, loving presence of the Church in Welwyn Garden City and beyond. God bless you and your loved ones.
