

FINANCE IN WELWYN GARDEN CITY Fr. Norbert writes: With the merger of the three parishes into one on 1st January, 2023, we are now required by the Diocese to have only one bank account. This will be the one at St. Bonaventure's; so, in due course all standing orders and paying of bills will need to be moved into this account. This means we need ALL OF YOU to look again at your standing orders, please. If it was set up at St. Bonaventure's and you want to reassess it, giving more or less according to your circumstances, then please make out a new standing order through your bank and let us know through the Form attached to the newsletter. This will also give us your up-to-date contact details. For those of you who set up standing orders at Holy Family or Our Lady's, we ask you to make out a new standing order using the attached. You need to inform your bank of the ending of the previous standing order and then instruct them to set up the new standing order with the new bank details. It would help hugely if as many of you would use standing orders to make your regular gift to the church. Sometimes (or often) the machines at the back of the churches play up! Standing orders should be more straightforward. We also ask those of you who are tax-payers to allow the parish to claim back the tax you have paid - GiftAid. This results in an extra source of income which doesn't cost you anything as long as you are a tax-payer. The donation must come from a bank account in the name of the taxpayer who is claiming Gift Aid which can be a joint account. Thank you for your great generosity - it is much appreciated.

WALSINGHAM PILGRIMAGE On Saturday 20th May, we will be going by coach to Walsingham and will join the National Pilgrimage of the Deaf. Walsingham is a Shrine of Our Lady dating back to 1061. A lady called Richeldis had a vision and was asked to build a copy of the Holy House of Nazareth. It became a pre-eminent place of pilgrimage until the Reformation. It has now become once more the National Shrine of Our Lady in this country. The coach will leave from Our Lady's at 8am and depart from Walsingham around 4.30pm (arriving back around 7pm). There will be Mass and we will walk the Holy Mile. Please bring a picnic lunch hopefully to be enjoyed in good weather! Then there will be time to visit the Slipper Chapel and have personal prayer. The cost is £20 per seat. Please fill in one of the forms at the back of the church and return it with your money to Fr. Norbert.

ELY The Christian Churches in WGC have arranged a day out in Ely on Saturday 10th June. Fr. Norbert who chairs the group has booked three coaches for this trip, which will give local Christians the opportunity to spend a day together. It includes our own special pilgrim service in the Cathedral, a tour of the Cathedral, and free time in Ely. We conclude our time in Ely with Evensong. The coaches will leave from outside Our Lady's at 8.15am and depart from Ely at 6.15pm. THE HOLY FAMILY CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL Are you looking for a way to live out your faith and serve your local community at the same time? If so, becoming a Foundation Governor would be an excellent way to do this. Foundation Governors play an important role in maintaining and developing the Catholic Life and Mission of Catholic schools. School governors also play a vital role in the strategic development of a school in areas such as finance, curriculum and site management. Generally the role of Foundation Governor will take up around 10 hours of your time each month, there is a minimum requirement of attending three full governing body meetings per year and serving on a committee. Free training will always be provided for new governors and this continues throughout all governors' terms of office. Foundation Governors must be practising Catholics. INSPECTION Catholic schools receive a separate inspection on behalf of the Bishops, now called a Catholic Schools Inspection (previously section 48.) A new inspection framework has been introduced and Holy Family was one of the first schools in the Diocese of Westminster to be inspected under this revised and more rigorous framework on 8th and 9th February 2023.
