Fourth Sunday of Easter 30th April 2023

We are entering historic times as we await the Coronation of King Charles III! Just think, the last Coronation was almost 70 years ago! Not many people had televisions then and so households gathered in the homes of those who owned one. The course of history with empires, kingdoms, rulers and borders has changed beyond recognition. Now we stop to pray, asking God to watch over our country and the Commonwealth at this momentous point in time.

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, the Church asks us to focus on a different King - Jesus Christ. We are half-way through our paschal festivities and we remember the Shepherd-King who laid down his life for his flock and leads us to pastures eternal in the wonder and glory of heaven. Today's Gospel passage comes at the start of Chapter 10 of St. John where the Lord refers to himself not only as the Shepherd of the flock, but as 'the Gate of the sheepfold'. The text finishes with the powerful words: 'I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.' (10:10) Jesus opens up the way for humanity to life - life in full measure; he himself is that opening which comes through his dying and rising. This Shepherd wants the very best for each one of us! Christ speaks of his intimate knowledge of the flock and how each one is able to recognise his voice. Thus, they are not afraid of following him.

There is an invitation today for us to consider that we have been called, that we ARE being called. We have a vocation! Jesus Christ has a place, a role, for us in his flock. He sees something amazing in each one of us and, as this gift develops, we enrich the flock as a whole, as well as growing in our own stature as his disciples. WHO are you? HOW has the Lord blessed you? WHICH gifts enable you to be effective as witnesses to Christ? WHERE are you heading? In the Church we believe there are many vocations each with a dignity and significance; they complement one another. Sometimes others can see in a person an ability to carry out a particular role and it is incumbent on those with discernment to speak and the other to listen and reflect.

When I was 6 or 7 years old, I felt I wanted to be a priest and so I offered myself at the age of 18 and was accepted for formation. 6 years of study, pastoral work, reflection and the knowledge that others were praying for me led to my priestly ordination in St. Anthony's, Edgware in 1988. Then the real learning began! Through people and situations, God helped me to understand what he was asking of me. I was opened up to new experiences and came face to face with fresh challenges and then I really knew why he had called me and how he had equipped me for this service. On 11th June I will celebrate 35 years of being a priest! I haven't regretted the decision one bit. I still need lots of prayers and there is even more waiting to be discovered!

THE CORONATION OF KING CHARLES III The Bishops' Conference has printed special prayer cards to mark this historic event. Please take one of them. There will be a Triduum of Prayer from Wednesday in readiness for Saturday's Coronation. Prayers will be said at Mass and individuals/households are asked to add their prayers at home.

FRIDAY 5TH MAY The Bishops' Conference has waived the Friday abstinence, so people can celebrate in anticipation of the Coronation. There will be the First Friday Mass at 6.30am at St. Bonaventure's followed by a festive breakfast in the Hall! Everyone is welcome! This Mass will be livestreamed.

FINANCE IN WELWYN GARDEN CITY Fr. Norbert writes: At Easter the new standing order forms were distributed with the one account for the merged Welwyn Garden City Parish. Many of you have returned these completed. Thank you! I would ask others please to consider setting up a standing order to make your regular gift to the church. Sometimes (or often) the machines at the back of the churches play up! Standing orders should be more straightforward and give us a steady income. We also ask those of you who are tax-payers to allow the parish to claim back the tax you have paid - GiftAid. This results in an extra source of income which doesn't cost you anything as long as you are a tax-payer. The donation must come from a bank account in the name of the taxpayer who is claiming Gift Aid which can be a joint account.

CAFOD works with small farmers around the world who produce lots of the world's foods. But many of them are facing a huge problem.

For hundreds of years they have freely used and shared their own seeds, but laws are being passed that limit what they are allowed to do with their own seeds, giving them little choice but to buy more expensive seeds from large companies. These laws make it even harder for small farmers and their families produce enough food. Did you know back in the 1980s the ten biggest seed companies controlled less than 15% of the market. Today, just 4 companies control 50% of the market.

In the coming weeks we will be asking for your help to support small scale farmers around the world by signing a letter written by one such farmer to the World Bank.
