

Twenty-sixth Sunday of the Year 25th September 2016 p. 143 of book

The parables continue with today's instalment from St. Luke as Jesus tells the story of The Rich Man and Lazarus. Further challenge from the Lord... more to think about on our part! So often good fortune and riches in general were regarded in Jesus' time as blessings from God. So, the Rich Man is regarded as receiving his reward here and now; Lazarus must have done wrong and so he is in a pitiable state.

The frightening thing for many in Jesus' audience must have been the reversal which comes about at death. How can it be that this Rich Man is now suffering and Lazarus is in bliss with Abraham? Even more interesting is the plea by the Rich Man to return to his brothers to put them on the right track and the reply that they should read the Scriptures and discover therein the counsel as to how to behave. As with so many of the parables we are left without the fairy tale answer '..and they all lived happily ever after.'! We have to reflect on what our response should be.

What do YOU think? Are riches a sign of blessing from God? As you ponder on your own circumstances, do you feel God has let you down? Or do you rejoice that all is going well? The Rich Man seemed to be totally unaware of the presence of Lazarus at his gate. Are there people close to you in dire need whom you fail to support? Do you take time to read the Scriptures both of the New and Old Testaments and take to heart the message of the prophets or of Jesus himself? There is no easy answer and we can find ourselves slipping into a mentality of being closed to others and basking in our own good fortune however little or big that might be.

Let each of us remember that God wants everyone to be with him eternally. God has never stopped trying to find ways of opening people up to the grace which brings eternal life. But if hearts, minds and souls are closed or stony, there is very little which can be done from a human point of view to change the situation. 'All things are possible for God!' This was the message from the Angel to Our Lady at the Annunciation. God's gift of his Son Jesus is the ultimate sign which can overcome any and every barrier. Let us ask him to help us!

FIRST CONFESSION & FIRST HOLY COMMUNION At St. Bonaventure's preparation for the children happens on a Saturday morning once a month. At Holy Family and Our Lady's the children's classes will start in the new year. Parents sessions will also be in the new year. Enrolment meetings: Our Lady's - Tuesday 1st November at 8pm; Holy Family - Sunday 6th November after 9.30 Mass. Children should be at least in Year 3 at school. CONFIRMATION Young people (at least in Year 9 at school) who wish to be confirmed should come with their parents to a meeting on Sunday 9th October at 7pm at Our Lady's Church. Preparation starts in November.

RCIA If you are an adult who wish to join the Catholic Church or if you are a Catholic who missed out on Confirmation when younger and now feel ready to be confirmed, come to Our Lady's Sacristy on Monday 3rd October 7.30pm. There will be a chance to meet others and find out more about what is involved.

ST. ALBANS Bishop John Sherrington will be preaching at an Ecumenical Evensong at St. Alban's Abbey Cathedral on Saturday 8th October at 4pm for this Year of Mercy. Bishop John would like all the schools of Hertfordshire to lead a procession from Verulamium Park at 2.30pm which will enter the Abbey and prepare for Evensong. There will be an enactment of the martyrdom of St. Alban with massive puppets, music and prayer. Everyone is welcome. SPECIAL NEEDS MASS on Saturday 1st October at 6pm at Our Lady's. OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD (SHOEBOXES) We will again be supporting this charity by filling and sending shoe boxes to children in need around the world particularly migrants and refugees. As you go around the shops please buy some little gifts to put in these boxes (they don't need to be expensive) - there are leaflets at the back of each church advising you about what can or cannot be included - please read carefully. Filled boxes, knitted hats, scarves, gloves/mittens can be brought to St. Bonaventure's or whichever church you attend as soon as you have them ready. We have some flat pack boxes for you to use if you don't have a box at home. Please take one if you can fill it.

MOTHER AND TODDLER at St. Bonaventure's. This informal and friendly group meets every Wednesday from 10am. Come and let your baby or toddler play whilst you enjoy the company of other mums, grandparents or carers. All are welcome from our three parishes and from the local community, no need to let anyone know you are coming - just turn up.

SECONDARY SCHOOL TRANSFER Fr. Norbert writes: It is important for parents to go to school open days/evenings with their children in September/October and see the options. Read the admissions criteria carefully to ensure you have a good chance of getting into the school if it is oversubscribed. Get hold of your child's Baptismal Certificate in good time. Think about the environment in which your child will flourish. In terms of the Certificate of Catholicity, the form will be given by the schools and will have to be signed by Fr. Norbert. The Certificate of Catholicity is a statement that the child comes from a practising Catholic family which means there is attendance at Mass every week. To facilitate this, Fr. Norbert will give out an 'extra' form for WGC parishes for parents to fill out for him. These can be collected from him *before or after Mass*. Meetings will be as follows: Tuesday 4th October 4 - 6pm, Monday 10th October 4 - 7pm, Friday 14th October 4 - 6pm. when parent/s and child will come to meet with Fr. Norbert at Our Lady's Church.
