

The newsletter is back in action! I hope your Christmas and the bringing in of the New Year went well. With Christmas falling on a Sunday, didn't it create a very different experience? Now 2017 is well underway with its opportunities and challenges, with resolutions being kept (?!), perhaps with apprehension as our world moves into a new era with the USA's new President taking up the reins and 'Brexit' still unfolding.

'I will make you the light of the nations so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.' These are the words of the Lord spoken to the prophet Isaiah in today's First Reading. Perhaps we might reflect on them this Sunday at the start of a new calendar year? Firstly, it is God's work which will turn us into lights. What does it mean for YOU to be a light? Where does the Lord want you to shine? At work, in school, at home or in the community? Are you being made into a blinding spotlight, a flickering flame or a raging fire? Obviously, to be the correct source of light for a particular situation is essential; so there is nothing wrong in being a small torch. How is he transforming you? The Lord speaks of his 'salvation'; this is one of those technical words we use which has many layers of means. At face value, this word infers being saved - saved from who or what? When Jesus saves people he brings healing into their lives so that deep down they may experience his peace and a harmony of love. The Lord wants the salvation to reach to the ends of the earth. It is fascinating that here in our town and wider area, we have peoples from so many different parts of the world with various cultures, languages and traditions. How can ALL OF US harness what we have here in such a way that there is a dynamic force extending back across the face of the earth? May our working together and our much respect and appreciation be a beacon! Let us ask God to bless us personally so that we may radiate his presence in our daily lives too.

PEACE SUNDAY Catholics across England and Wales are taking up the challenge that Pope Francis issued in his World Peace message: "Nothing is impossible if we turn to God in prayer. Everyone can be an artisan of peace". The theme for 2017 is 'Nonviolence: a style of politics for peace'; it is the first time that nonviolence has been explored as a force more powerful in seeking peace, recognising that it is not merely a tactic but a way of life. In his letter to parishes for Peace Sunday, Archbishop Malcolm McMahon, Archbishop of Liverpool and President of Pax Christi said: "The message of Pope Francis offers a timely opportunity for our parishes to explore the Catholic tradition of nonviolence which goes back to Jesus, and to develop ways to make Gospel nonviolence better known." Pax Christi sees Peace Sunday as the start of a year-long process of reflection and study of the message and all that it has to offer our world community in better responding to injustice and violence.

JULIAN OF NORWICH - MEDITATION at St. John's Church, Monks Rise AL8 7NF on Saturday 28th January 6.30 - 7.45pm. Julian of Norwich was a woman of her time, the 14th Century, a woman who had received 16 Divine Revelations when she was about 30 years old. She spent the rest of her life, locked away in a cell - at her own choosing - reflecting on all that God had revealed to her. The Meditation being presented at St John's is an adapted version of her reflections in original music and dance, backed up by artistic interpretations and narration. Free entry...All welcome.
