
WELWYN GARDEN CITY



Tomorrow (Monday) I celebrate 30 years of Priesthood. I give thanks to God for my family, friends, parishioners and so many others who have nurtured me in Faith, in a love for people and places, in a zest for life - AND continue to do so! It never gets boring! I have been blessed with opportunities, challenges and circumstances which have offered me fresh perspectives and a chance to grow as a person, developing new skills for a fresh season in life, thus giving glory to God. Priesthood is a precious gift - a bit like love - which, when received from God and put at the service of others, increases, blossoms and grows! I love being a priest and all that I am called to do and to be. I have nearly completed ten years in Welwyn Garden City. I'm not on the list of this year's moves!

In our Gospel passage today we are taken by St. Mark to the earlier period in Jesus' ministry, when he returns home. What difficulties he faces! His family are convinced he's out of his mind and set out 'to take charge of him'. Can you imagine the scene? Then the scribes claim that Jesus is possessed by an unclean spirit and that it is this 'spirit' which is the source of Jesus' power. To accuse Jesus of being a man of evil, driven by Beelzebul the prince of devils, is an unpardonable sin because it goes against God himself, who is Jesus' inspiration. Jesus IS the Son of God! Our passage concludes with Jesus looking at those sitting in a circle about him and describing them as his family, the ones who do the will of God. St. Mark's community remembered the events of this day in Jesus' life, perhaps realising that just as they faced persecution in the city of Rome under the Emperor Nero, so Jesus himself had encountered difficulties and persevered. Then they must have reflected on his looking at them, loving them and counting them as his family. How loved and appreciated they must have felt!

As we begin another week, let us pray that Jesus Christ may be our inspiration and that words and actions springing from us may put others in touch with him. Thank you for your dedication. With love and prayers, *Fr. Norbert*
