

Twenty-third Sunday of the Year 8th September page 133 of Mass Book

'Great crowds accompanied Jesus on his way, and he turned and spoke to them...' These are the words from St. Luke in today's Gospel passage. It seems to be St. Luke's way of reminding us - the readers/listeners - that Jesus is still on the journey to Jerusalem. He is not travelling on his own; he not only has his followers and friends - there are so many others trying to come closer to him and enter his company. We are not told all their reasons for walking alongside him; these will unravel in due course. The Lord's teaching today is to the point and challenging: Jesus must come first, discipleship includes the Cross, we have to plan, using our God-given abilities to make the path bear much fruit. These parables used by Christ tease our minds into considering what the cost of being Jesus' follower is, whether it is worth it and can we live up to what is demanded. Remember he never asks us to do things unaided - the power and victory of the Cross he carried support us in our endeavours.

Today as we gather, there are new people in our midst. We welcome Fr. Tony Thomas who starts this weekend as Assistant Priest. We wish him much happiness in his ministry and look forward to getting to know him better. There are visitors with us and there are people who have just moved into the area. It is good to have you here! We think of Fr. Tom beginning his service of the people of South Harrow and Northolt and wish him well. Perhaps other parishioners have moved away and are embarking on new chapters in their lives. May the Lord's grace and joy be with them. Some of you will remember the Foundation Stone of Our Lady's Church being laid; next Sunday the Cardinal will be in our midst to mark this Anniversary. Everyone is welcome. Community life involves change, development, celebrations, the ordinary. We are all caught up with Christ in a journey to life, love and eternity. May our stopping off today help us on this path.

FR. TONY WRITES: I am delighted to have been appointed as assistant priest in Welwyn Garden City. This is my second post in the diocese having been ordained three years ago, in June 2016. When I look back on my journey to this point, I can reflect that God is full of surprises! I was not raised a Catholic and for much of my life God did not feature in my thinking at all. In my twenties and early thirties, I was almost entirely focused on my career in banking. It was only when I became good friends with a Catholic who was very committed to his faith that I began to realise that something was missing in my life. My friend seemed to have a sense of peace and purpose I lacked at that time. To cut a long story short, I began to attend Mass and then joined an RCIA course. I knew very soon that I wanted to enter the Church and – to my own surprise and also that of my family and friends! - I became a Catholic at Easter, 2003. The Eucharist was central to my new-found faith, and this led to an increasing sense that God was calling me to become a priest. I decided to leave my work and spent some time volunteering abroad and working in a parish in north London. These experiences confirmed my sense of vocation and I entered the seminary in 2011, to begin a five-year programme of studies. Priesthood is a wonderful way of life and I am excited to find out what God has planned for me here in Welwyn Garden City. I look forward to meeting you and getting to know you over the coming months. God bless, Fr. Tony.
