Second Sunday of Easter 19th April 2020

There are no easy answers except to acknowledge with St. Thomas that Jesus is Lord and God, the One who really and truly understands and is with us in our passion, with those in death and definitely offering the life of Resurrection. These weeks have been so challenging and demanding. We are no way near 'normal'. Take time this week to reflect on any blessings you can with confidence say you have received from God. Perhaps even write them down. They are treasures to be prized. There are countless members of society who do not know the Risen Lord explicitly and yet they have put us in touch with him. We must never forget them! Let us journey together through another week and yearn with all our hearts to come to that time of healing and peace when all improves. Let us pray for this.
