Sixth Sunday of Easter 17th May 2020

The Easter Season is racing by! In two Sundays' time we will arrive at Pentecost and conclude our celebration of the Paschal Mystery. This Thursday we have the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord when we mark Christ's return to the Father in glory and get ready for the bestowing of the Holy Spirit. In each of our Scripture readings today we hear about the 'Spirit'. What do you think of when you see or hear that term 'Holy Spirit'? A dove, a breath, a raging wind, a flame, a furnace, drops of rain, a torrential downpour, a deep well, a devastating flood...? The list is endless!

In the passage from the Acts of the Apostles, we are told that the Samaritans receive the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands. This makes me think of Confirmation which seals and completes what was initiated at Baptism. I reflect on Holy Orders, each of which involves the prayer of the Church and the laying on of hands by the bishop on the candidate. In the Sacrament of the Sick, the laying on of hands is essential as the priest asks the Lord to fill the seriously ill person with the healing, comfort grace of the Holy Spirit.

St. Peter's First Letter tells us 'in the body he (Christ) was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.' In the earlier Sundays of Eastertide, the Church gave us Resurrection appearances of Jesus. The One who really died and was buried, burst into life and this came about through the Holy Spirit. It definitely was not 'resuscitation' - there was a transformation and yet continuity, an amazing newness of life and yet a conviction that this was the same Jesus his friends had known. The Spirit has incredible strength and yet there is gentleness beyond measure. Just call to mind loved ones who have died...try to picture them sharing in this bodily resurrection of Jesus and blossoming anew with the risen life of Christ. That is our hope. This is the call from God through his Son Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit!

n St. John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the Advocate which the Father will give, the Spirit of truth. Jesus states clearly that 'you know him because he is with you, he is in you.' These words are first uttered to the disciples at the Last Supper; now they are intimated to us. Ponder what the Lord is saying: this Spirit is *with* us and is *in* us. When have you known his presence guiding you? When have you felt him deep within? There is still more 'Spirit' to be conferred as the Father's gift! The Holy Spirit keeps coming!

We are now at such a crucial point in the unfolding of the pandemic and lockdown. Truly God's Spirit is needed for guidance, discernment, ingenuity, inspiration, imagination, courage, hope and serenity. Let us pray hard for God's Holy Spirit to renew the face of the earth and to touch us individually, to strengthen the relationship we have with God and with each other.

Fr. Tony and I continue to pray for you. Please remember us too. God bless you. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

NOVENA OF PRAYER In the final part of the Easter Season (Ascension to Pentecost) as we look forward to the bestowing of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (31st May), the Church invites us to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and bestow gifts in abundance. Why not pray each day this traditional prayer?

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And you shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the gift of that same Spirit, we may be always truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reflect on the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord.

Consider the twelve fruits of the Spirit: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, faithfulness, modesty, self-control and chastity.

Which do you especially need at this time? Ask, open yourself up and receive this grace from God.
