I love the imagery used in today's First Reading! Isaiah speaks of a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, of food rich and juicy, of fine strained wines. Can you picture the table? Does the aroma of the food fire up your taste-buds? Can you feel the silky wine sliding down your throat? What a feast this will be at the end of time! Moreover, we are told that Death will be destroyed for ever and tears will be wiped from every cheek. There is hope, joy and salvation on God's mountain; his hand rests on it.

At this time, as we face another major spike of the coronavirus, hope is desperately needed. We lived through the spring and summer with many shielding, with not being able to meet up with loved ones or embrace them in a natural way. There was the sadness of death, the pain of grief and the heroism of so many front-line workers. Now we are embarking on another road. The picture proffered by the prophet is of the best food and drink not just for an individual but for countless guests. You know the feeling of being at a celebration: talking, listening, laughing, crying, eating, drinking, moments of silence - being TOGETHER. This IS heaven and it can be experienced here on earth.

As we enter a new path in this time of pandemic, let each of us think about who we need to accompany us, who we should be on the lookout for, within our homes, the streets we live on, in the community. Let us consciously determine to face the autumn and winter together so that no one is alone or utterly fearful. Surely this is what it means to be Church - a community of people called by God to share in the life of his Son. In the Second Reading ,as St. Paul writes to the people of Philippi, he says '...it was good of you to share with me in my hardships. In return my God will fulfil all your needs, in Christ Jesus, as lavishly as only God can.' How powerful are these words in our present situation. The Gospel parable from St. Matthew reveals a wedding feast to which those invited come up with excuses not to attend. The king's servants are told to go and collect anyone they could find - good and bad alike. People who least expected to be there, now share in the gracious bounty of the king at his Son's wedding feast. They are delighted to have been found and respond immediately. The tail end of the parable has the scene of the king looking over his guests and discovering one who is not wearing a wedding garment. This man is thrown outside. This always seems so harsh given the compassion of Jesus in his ministry. However, the lesson for us is that we must never take for granted the invitation we have received and accepted. There is responsibility which goes with it: faith must be lived out! Use your imagination for a moment: what would a wedding garment look like on you? Are there many hidden kindnesses that are a part of your being? Is there obvious graciousness revealed? Is forgiveness - offered and received - a hallmark? Who helps you to create such a garment? This is worth pondering as we take seriously all that is being lavished upon us by our God in Christ Jesus his Son.

So, stay safe and keep well. Let us pray for one another. May the bonds of faith and community hold us together. Fr. Tony and I ask God's blessing upon you. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

SACRAMENTS

Below is the latest information for our parishes here in Welwyn Garden City based on Government guidelines and those issued by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. As you realise many things keep changing with very little notice, so please bear with us. Thank you for your patience!

BAPTISMS of babies and infants can now be arranged. Please contact Fr. Tony or Fr. Norbert directly to make arrangements. No more than 6 people can be present.

CONFIRMATIONS (from last year's group) will take place in November. Candidates are being contacted.

FIRST COMMUNIONS Children will be making their First Holy Communion in the three churches at scheduled and 'extra' Masses. Please note that the Scripture readings on weekdays may be changed to link up with the Sunday. Congratulations to the children receiving Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion. More next weekend.

WEDDINGS can take place with no more than 15 people present.

FUNERALS with no more than **30** people present are now permitted in church.

RCIA Congratulations and welcome to the many new members who have joined the joined the Catholic Church over the last weeks. We are so grateful to the catechists who have supported them on their faith journey. *If any adults are interested in joining the Catholic Church or if you are an adult who missed out on Confirmation when younger, please contact Fr. Norbert.*

FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF OUR PARISHES We are not having a collection at Mass! CAFOD FAST DAY was on Friday 9th. CAFOD has taken the theme of 'survive build heal' for this year. There is the obvious awareness that the coronavirus is affecting peoples everywhere. CAFOD asks us to support our brothers and sisters in developing countries by helping set up handwashing stations, providing PPE for health workers, providing children with pencils and books as they study at home, helping farmers safely sell their produce and delivering food packages to those who cannot go out to work. METANOIA 'Who do you say I am?' On Thursday we had the first session of our new online course called 'Metanoia'. Each week in the newsletter we will summarise the teaching from the latest session, and offer a brief reflection based on its themes: Who is Jesus? Jesus takes his disciples to Caesarea Philippi, a place riddled with images of pagan gods and idols. It is important that Jesus brings them to this place that elicits many images of gods. Jesus asks the disciples who people think he is. There are all kinds of various answers, but the significant question is whether or not they know who Jesus is. This is significant because Jesus will depart from Caesarea Philippi and begin his journey to Jerusalem, which will end with his death. It is imperative that the disciples know who he is before they begin their gruelling journey. Reflection: Take some time when you are not distracted, when you have a few minutes, and ask God to reveal to you the difference between who you think he is and who he is. Ask God to place on your heart what it means that he is the Christ, that he is your Christ, that he is close to you and that he has rescued you.

PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS IN WELWYN GARDEN CITY

The Sunday obligation has been dispensed so you are free to attend Mass on any day. There is space too on weekdays for people to come more than once. Mass will continue to be streamed on a Sunday at 10am *Please note that at present we cannot use the heating in our churches because they have strong blowers and would transmit any airborne virus. We apologise for this. Best to wrap up well if the weather turns much colder.*

As you arrive there are stewards outside to make sure people respect distancing and to take contact details (name and phone number which will be held securely for 21 days). For those who have downloaded the Government Covid-19 App, please use the QR Code which has been created (one for each church). Stewards sanitise hands on entry. Face masks are mandatory. More stewards lead you to places. People must sit in their 'bubbles', that is as couples, families or households. We have single chairs for individuals. We ask that you only sit or stand in your place and do not use the kneeler. Once the church has reached its capacity, we are not be allowed to admit any more. Parents are asked to keep a watchful eye on their children at all times. Remember toilets are not available. There are no Mass-books or printed newsletters. You do not have to 'book' to come, but please arrive EARLY!

The structure of the Mass has been simplified so that people are not in an enclosed place for longer than 30 minutes: no singing or music, no 2nd Reading or Bidding Prayers, no Gloria or Creed, no collection, Offertory procession or Sign of Peace, no Communion from the Chalice, no altar servers, no lighting of votive candles. At the time of Holy Communion, the priest says to the whole congregation 'The Body of Christ' to which you all respond 'Amen'. Only the priest receives at that point. After the Blessing and Dismissal, stewards guide people from their benches to the front of the sanctuary, keeping distance at all times. Those who wish to receive Holy Communion may only receive in the hand with no words uttered by priest or communicant and then you leave the church - in Holy Family by the doors either side of the sanctuary, and in Our Lady's by the side door on the left and by the 'Holy Door' at the back on the right. Even those not receiving Holy Communion must follow this flow. As you exit the church, the stewards sanitise your hands.

We have been reminded by our Bishops that people should not gather outside church in a social way before or after Mass as this may be a source of further contagion. We ask you to respect the stewards who are your fellow parishioners and are doing their best to facilitate the whole process.

Only the priest prepares the vessels for Mass and the ciboria (with hosts) have their lids on until Holy Communion is distributed at the end.

After each Mass the stewards sanitise everything which has had human contact and prepare the church for the next Mass. Any property left behind has to be disposed of. We have purchased masks, plastic aprons and gloves for stewards/cleaners as well as sufficient sanitising and cleaning materials.

Some of you may not feel ready to return because of health issues or because you care for someone who is vulnerable. Others might still be afraid and this is totally understandable.

If you think you have the virus, please do NOT come and put others at risk. COVID 19 symptoms: a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature), a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual), a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste.

We are very grateful to the many volunteers who have helped as stewards and spent time cleaning the churches after Mass. Some have now returned to work. If any others are available on a weekday or at the weekend, please let Fr. Tony or Fr. Norbert know. Thank you.

CONFESSION On the days when public Mass is celebrated, Fr. Tony and Fr. Norbert will NOT be able to hear Confessions before or after Mass. However, ring Fr. Tony on 01707 327434 or Fr. Norbert on 01707 323234 if you would like to make an appointment for Confession. The Sacrament will be outside the church building with priest and penitent standing; every attempt will be made to keep distance and reduce the risk of infection either way, while respecting the confidentiality of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The church will NOT be open for prayer after.
