Second Sunday of Easter 11th April 2021

As I write this piece on Friday afternoon, the airwaves are filled with the news of the death of HRH The Prince Philip who had almost reached the age of 100. This is a tragic loss for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, whose spouse had been by her side for so many decades. There is the realisation of the strength of their Marriage bond lasting so long. World leaders are all making their comments as well as local politicians contributing to the encomium of one who has played such a prominent part in the life of the Royal Family. Details are yet to be announced of the Funeral, but our prayer is that he may rest in peace.

In our Gospel passage, we hear about someone who died who comes back! Yes, Jesus whose disciples are petrified reaches out to them with peace and the breath of his Spirit, commissioning them to continue his Mission. We are told by St. John that Thomas who is a great doubter MUST see and touch the wounds of the Risen Lord, thus confirming the continuity of the Lord who appears with the Crucified One who had been such a firm companion. Thomas is rewarded with what he seeks and becomes the great believer naming Jesus as his 'Lord and God'! We are then given an insight into the Lord's love for us as he says how lucky are those 'who have not seen and yet believe.' We are indeed happy!

Almost seven days after Easter Sunday, I am so grateful to God for the Mystery we celebrated during the course of Holy Week. Liturgies were stripped down to the basics leaving a powerful simplicity which was arresting and forced us to contemplate the magnitude of what was unfolding. Watches didn't matter but if you did snatch a look, you would have been surprised at the speed of the Liturgy!

Thinking into the future, what will we take with us from Easter 2021 into the future? The French seminarians-now-priests who visited us over the years are tied by a curfew, so they had to celebrate their Easter Vigil at 6 o'clock as the sun was rising and then move straight into the Easter Sunday Masses. They told me that the experience was wonderful but that they now feel almost 'dead'!! Easter requires a great deal of stamina for the duration of the major Services but then energy and imagination are required for the 50 Days of celebration. For those of you still shielding, I hope you felt the presence of Christ coming to you with love and understanding. We all continue to wait and see, wondering when we will move into the next phase.
