OUR LADY,

It's hard to believe that we have nearly completed five months of the calendar year! Time races by and while we have an easing of so many regulations there is much to think about in regard to a return to 'normal'. Obviously we are all aware of the new strain and possible additional challenges as people return from abroad. We have to be so careful and keep up our guard whilst allowing an enjoyment of life to animate us.

In our Gospel reading today, the Church takes us to the final verses of St. Matthew's Gospel as we celebrate Trinity Sunday. Jesus gives the Great Commission, sending his Apostles out to all nations, baptising in the name of the Trinity and teaching his commands. He ends with those powerful words: 'Know that I am with you; yes, to the end of time.' The evangelist describes the disciples worshipping the Lord though some hesitated. He fills us with hope and confidence in the abiding presence of Jesus. We are left with the image of sending out; this continues in our day.

In our present situation, we cannot go to the nations! Travel and a venturing out are not as straightforward as they might have been centuries ago! We have transport and speed but not the permission. The first Apostles made use of what we would regard as primitive modes of transport and managed to get everywhere! Someone people are ready to jump back into ordinary life; others are slowly feeling their way forward and are hesitant.

Let us never forget that our God, who is the source of all creation, desired to come to share our lives and offer us a pathway to his eternal life and love. The life of the Trinity is revealed in Jesus Christ who was obedient to the Father, filled with the Spirit and became the revelation of the Eternal Word who became flesh for our salvation. Jesus Christ shows us humanity at its very best and is the pattern of how we can and should be with the strength of divine grace.

Let us ask God to watch over us all in the coming months and to bless us in all we undertake. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*
