Corpus Christi 6th June 2021

St. Mark takes us to the scene of the Last Supper in today's Gospel reading for Corpus Christi. The significance of Jesus' actions unfolds in his taking bread and wine and pronouncing them to be his Body and his Blood, the ultimate signs of his love revealed in his Passion, Death and Resurrection. What would it have been like to be present? Looking at the faces of his disciples, what would you have learned? Watching those Sacred hands clutching the unleavened bread and clasping the cup of wine, would the intensity of love have overwhelmed you? This saving Sacrifice and Sacred Banquet formed such an amazing parting gift to his friends and, in turn, to us.

This coming Friday I will celebrate 33 years of being a priest. What is so wonderful is that I have never got bored or fed up with what the Lord has asked of me! The parish setting puts me in touch with you, the variety of your lives, the challenges we face together and the joys we experience. No two days are the same with doorbells and phone calls, the expected and the unexpected, the mysterious and the mundane. For me, the heightened moment of my ministry and calling comes at the Eucharist: WE are together - live or through the internet; the Lord is intimately close to us, sharing passionate love through his offering of himself to the Father; heaven and earth touch one another in an amazing exchange; we are united with a multitude across the world and in God's presence; in a moment of sheer bliss, time is not the most important consideration. When I speak in persona Christi (in the person of Christ), the words uttered by the Lord at the Last Supper: 'This is my Body...this is my Blood', I am aware of you and consciously draw you into this mystical consecration of the earthly into the heavenly, the human into the divine. We are all members of Christ's Body, offered to the Father. Jesus Christ, who nourishes us with his very life, draws us into a profound act of worship. It is not always easy to find

words adequate enough to express the reality; nevertheless God breaks into our lives and supports us in our journey to him.

Today's great Solemnity gives us an opportunity to reflect on the Eucharist and say 'Thank you' to God for this gift. The Church presents us with teaching to get our minds and hearts racing as we fathom the enormity of what it means for bread and wine to become Christ's Body and Blood, to be our nourishment and food for the journey to heaven.

May God bless you and all your loved ones. You are in my prayers. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*
