Isn't life getting more and more challenging with changing red, amber and green countries, attempts at holidays and variants-plus breaking in on the scene?! There are extra complications with restrictions being eased, rules not being adhered to and exceptions-to-the-rules being allowed! How are you approaching the summer? Are you just hoping for sunshine at home? Lots to chew over!

I have been fortunate enough (finally) to have some time away - in the form of a retreat. As many of you know, I love going to the Poor Clares in Arundel in West Sussex; in fact, next year will be thirty years since my first visit. There is time to be quiet and still, many moments for reflection, opportunities to read, the rhythm of the cloistered life with set prayer-times and Mass. This year the weather was absolutely brilliant! I was able to go for long walks and mull over a whole variety of things. The nuns have Mass at 8.30am and after celebrating the Eucharist and going outdoors, I was able to ponder what I had preached and further my contemplation of the Scriptures - quite a luxury! Are you waiting for me to say I am going to become a monk? Or leave to be a hermit? NO!!! However, the period of retreat gives me peace and serenity which sustain me in the every day. As I said before going on retreat, I love being a priest in a parish; it is such a joy and privilege. Carving out space for God and rediscovering a pace of life not-always-possible is a real treat! And I never stop remembering and praying for you!

In our Gospel passage today from St. Mark, after calming the storm at sea, Jesus is back in action accompanied by a large crowd. He has time for everyone, collectively and individually. He is interrupted and stops; he feels power coming out of him and looks around. His heart goes out to the man whose daughter is so poorly; he raises

her to life after she dies. He is so human in his dealings with, and awareness of, others; the grace of God never stops radiating from him. Let us focus on all that Jesus brings to us as individuals, to our homes and to our community. Let us ask him for support in this time of continuing pandemic and our need for refreshment and peace. Let us find moments to encounter him and appreciate all he wants to share.
