Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time 4th July 2021

I thought I'd wait until after the 'walk' to St. Albans Cathedral with Nicholas Breakspear School Year 12 before writing my newsletter piece. The forecast was for it to rain on Friday afternoon, after a sunny start to the day. So, I packed shoes which could get muddy and wore an anorak to keep warm and dry; AND it was so hot!!! It is really difficult in these times to predict anything and the weather proved to be no different. Walking and talking; feeling the warmth of the sun. It is very easy for us as followers of Jesus to take for granted what we already know of him, have learnt at home or in the family, in school or in the parish. However, there is always something extra to be discovered about the Son of God! If you had been in Nazareth, would you have gone along with the crowd's lack of appreciation or would you have tried to spend more time with Jesus? Would you have been dismissive of his words and actions or would you have tried to memorise this Good News from his lips? Would you have let your heart be touched by the warmth of this encounter?

Of course, we live in another part of the world and this moment in history is unique. Nevertheless, are you prepared to be misunderstood as Jesus was? To be written off as Christians solely because of your origins and background? To be disregarded for speaking the truth of Faith and for standing by it? These are challenging questions for people of every time and place; they require deep thought and reflection with the courage to respond.

Hopefully the weather will settle into pure sunshine and high temperatures?! We all are longing for a sense of summer which endures. There is football to entertain us, tennis to watch at Wimbledon and the cycling of the Tour de France to keep our gaze fixed on the television! What more would you like?!!
