OUR LADY,

In today's passage from St. Mark's Gospel, the Twelve return after being sent out by Jesus. They have much to tell him! Jesus sees how tired they are with so many people coming and going; he wants to give them time to rest. As the school holidays begin, I am sure that all in Education must feel the same! I hope the summer affords refreshment. We are so grateful to the staff and governors of our schools for their hard work and dedication. Children and young people have also faced such a challenging period - enjoy being on holiday!

For all of us this Monday is going to be a landmark moment as practically all restrictions are relaxed. Will it be back to normal? I'm not so sure! Can we easily travel abroad or welcome visitors? Not as straightforward! What's on the horizon? We just do not know! There is uncertainty as the number of cases continues to rise and freedoms are restored. The Government wants us all to take responsibility for protecting ourselves and others. That will be a minefield in a variety of ways.

Thinking about coming to church and the practices we have established these last 18 months, I know that those who attend feel safe: their hands are sanitised before and after Mass, the church buildings are thoroughly cleansed after each celebration, there is ventilation, distance between people in the pews and a general awareness of our concern for one another. I do not want us to lose this sense of security. Therefore, we will continue with the regime we have established for the coming weeks. I trust that those returning for the first time will have the confidence to regard the coming to church as a possibility, especially if they are clinically vulnerable. *We are so grateful to the teams of stewards who have tirelessly given of themselves in serving all of us for countless weeks and months.* In terms of Mass times and the use of

St. Bonaventure's, with holidays and many away, we are going to continue with the present schedule at least until September. The format of the celebration of Mass will continue until September too. Then we can return in one go to the 'full' Mass with books, ministers and altar servers, congregational singing too! In this 18-month period, we have worked so hard to keep one another safe. Please be patient here in Welwyn Garden City for a little longer.

When they arrive in the 'quiet' place, everyone was already there! No rest for the Twelve! Instead they experienced the compassion of Jesus for the crowds; he proved himself to be a Good Shepherd for all.

May God take care of you and your families. Remember your importance in God's eyes and the call to reach out to others with his love. God bless you! With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & ELDERLY PEOPLE

25th July 2021 will be the inaugural World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in the Catholic Church. Cardinal Vincent Nichols writes:

'Pope Francis is not young. In fact, he's getting on in years, but he has this terrific sense of the connection between generations and its importance. So I'm not surprised that he's established for this year on 25th July, a World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. One of the most remarkable things I remember him saying to a million young people at one of the World Youth Days was this: "If you want to be a sign of hope for the world, go and talk to your grandparents."

SONGS OF PRAISE This Sunday 18th July at 1.15pm on BBC One comes from Arundel. There will be interviews with some of the Poor Clares (with whom Fr. Norbert has spent time on retreat).

And in that way, he expressed so much of what we need in our society of the continuity between the generations. And a day of prayer is important because we're lacking in that often. Elderly people get isolated, grandparents often get forgotten. But a day of prayer will help us to remember that we are gifts to each other because we are gifts of God. And if we give thanks for those gifts, we'll appreciate them. FOCOLARE ANNOUNCEMENT Mari Ponticaccia, originally from the north of Italy, was one of the first members of the Focolare Movement to come to Britain in 1963. She was co-responsible for the development of the Movement in Britain, her primary focus always being to live and share the life of the Gospel. In the early '80s, Mari was instrumental in the purchase and establishing what is now the Centre for Unity on Parkway, Welwyn Garden City. In latter years Mari has not been well and left for Heaven on Tuesday 13th July. Her funeral will be in Our Lady's, WGC at 12.30pm on Tuesday 20th July. All are welcome and invited for light refreshments to the Centre for Unity, following the burial at Lawn Cemetery, Hatfield. May she rest in peace.
