I have had an opportunity to enjoy time away! My passport is gathering dust and the new experience of staycation is opening me up to so many possibilities. I have visited relations and friends in different parts of the country. I have gone for long walks and enjoyed a boat-ride on a river. I attended my first Premiership League match - Southampton versus Manchester United - and was warned that I would be thrown out if my behaviour was not impeccable! A friend took me 'forest bathing'...a walk through ancient woodlands taking in the aura of the trees and feeling the power of nature. It is so good to connect with people, creation and God too.

Last Sunday I celebrated Mass in St. Edmund's Church in Southampton during a few days' stay with a cousin in that city. I had to remember the name of the Bishop (Philip) in the Eucharistic Prayer! More importantly, it was wonderful to be with a Christian Community sharing in the familiar elements of the Liturgy handed down through the centuries and yet to do so in a fresh setting. I have celebrated four family Funerals in various churches in that city and last year a fifth could only be graveside because of the pandemic. There was a Wedding too at St. Edmund's. I was in Southampton the weekend Princess Diana died in the car crash of 1997. I am truly grateful for what I can do, see and rejoice in despite the restrictions. I am fortunate.

As we cast our gaze towards Afghanistan, our hearts are broken by the scene of total devastation and the sheer horror of human suffering inflicted by human beings on the defenceless, powerless and vulnerable. There seems to be no end to the injustices which are being perpetrated. All we can do is pray hard and ensure that in our own situations we are fair with others and generous in reaching out to those in need. It is a sad state of affairs and soon we will be remembering the events of 9/11 twenty years ago.

In our own parishes change has taken place with Fr. Tony leaving us to take up the reins in Stonebridge Park. We have been enriched by his presence and now await Fr. William Johnstone's arrival next month. He will learn the tools of his trade in Welwyn Garden City as a newly ordained priest! Another chapter of history will begin and in no time I will start my 14th year as your Parish Priest.

This summer we have journeyed through much of St. John Chapter 6 on Sundays together with the Visitation from St. Luke on the Assumption. Now we finally return to St. Mark's Gospel which will be our companion Sunday by Sunday until we enter Advent at the end of November. The evangelist takes us straight to controversy about the keeping of commandments and laws. There's much to chew on as we climb aboard the ship of St. Mark! Jesus is exasperated by the need of his opponents to cling to traditions and regulations while their hearts appear to be far from God. The Lord condemns lip-service as he quotes from the prophecy of Isaiah. Perhaps today as we listen to St. Mark we might consider our attitude to faith? Is our religion only about rules and regulations? Are our hearts aligned to God? What does it truly mean to be the Lord's follower and a bearer of Good News? Without parading our belief, do others see in us qualities that are found in Christ? Maybe the Bank Holiday weekend will afford us a few moments to take stock, reflect and respond?

# HERTS WELCOMES REFUGEES

Here is an update from Herts Welcomes Refugees (HWR) in the light of the unfolding crisis in Afghanistan:

You will all be concerned about the horrific situation in Afghanistan so here is an update on related activities in Hertfordshire.

There are already 24 Afghan families (130 individuals) in two hotels in the Watford area. They came here under the Afghan Relocations and Assistance Policy (ARAP Scheme) and have been given emergency, short term support from the Red Cross and assistance from the Home Office.

HWR, mainly via Kate Scott, our very active Area Convenor for Dacorum, and several other charities are taking, or have already delivered, clothing, children's toys and books and other urgently needed items.

At the moment we do not need any more of these - but we will let you know if we are asked for more.

What we do need are mobile phones - wiped - and/or Sim cards with  $\pounds 10$  or  $\pounds 20$  on them.

If you are able to provide any of these they can be posted to Kate at 80 Oak Cross Road, Berkhamsted, HP4 3HZ.

We realise that phones would be more expensive to post and if you prefer these could be dropped off at my house - 106 Handside Lane, WGC, AL8 6SY. (If the package won't fit through the letter box and there is no reply please go round the back of the house and leave on one of the cushioned chairs under the porch.

According to the Watford Observer Welwyn Hatfield is one of three Hertfordshire boroughs to have committed to taking in Afghan refugee families under the ARAP scheme.

#### Can you email your local councillors to say how glad you are about this? Apparently Grant Shapps has said he is looking forward to welcoming Afghans to the area so we should email him as well.

The HWR Management Team are discussing the impact the new arrivals will have on us and how we can help the local authorities who take in Afghan refugees. Obviously there will be more work to do but we will continue to support the refugees and asylum seekers who are already here and still need our help.
