Another month nearly completed! The sun has been shining and we've enjoyed warmth and beauty outdoors. What has your week been like? Challenges, frustrations, straightforward, delightful? Life is so varied and amazing...God works in all sorts of ways!

For me, a really uplifting occasion was on Thursday evening when a group of 16 Christian Leaders from our town gathered for the first time in 18 months to share a meal and have time together - no Zoom or total distancing! I asked those attending to come with a one-minute thought to offer the others based on the answer to the following question: 'How have you felt the Lord close to you during the pandemic?' It was very moving to hear the dreams and joys of such a diverse gathering. No right or wrong answers - just a word from the heart based on real experiences.

The pandemic has not left us totally; but we have the sense of a new beginning. How would you respond to my question? I suppose some of you are wondering what I said?! I spoke about how I wanted to stay well so that I could be there to serve you. I recalled the extra time I has for prayer and reflection - not always possible at other times! I offered the experience of going to the Lister to visit and minister to those dying of Covid-19 and the powerful witness of the loving care of the staff who were revealing such compassion and professionalism in the midst of so much heartache and tragedy.

In our Gospel reading from St. Mark, the Lord well and truly challenges us to put him first and not to let anything get in the way. The language used is Semitic in idiom and sounds so harsh to our modern ear; however, the turn of phrase pushes people to the extreme but does not intend the literal. The passage also forces us to acknowledge that God can and does choose to work beyond the boundaries we would expect - but that is God being God!

Let's take time this week to be open to the workings of God's Spirit in our own lives and allow ourselves to recognise that self-same Spirit in others. God bless you and keep you in his care. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

FR. TONY'S FAREWELL Fr. Tony is settling into his new parish and is beginning to feel at home. On a Sunday he doesn't have an evening Mass and so he and Fr. Norbert have agreed to have his Farewell Mass on Sunday 17th October at 6pm at Holy Family Church followed by a gathering with a presentation. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.

MASS IN WGC From Monday 8th November, the times of weekday and weekend Masses will return to their usual schedule. This means that St. Bonaventure's will be open again. The safety and security of all people is important. Mass intentions can be booked from that date in all three churches. Obviously with COVID-19 and all the restrictions we have faced, things might change but the desire is to establish a strong pattern which can be carried on for some time. In the coming weeks we will reflect on the way Mass is celebrated, the use of ministers and altar servers and also singing at Mass. The scheduled times of Confession will be reinstated from 8th November too.
