It seems a long time since I wrote to you! Fr. William has been kept busy these last weeks and has done so well. I was completely knocked out by a cold which went to my chest. Antibiotics did the trick, thank goodness. I was then supposed to take my 'summer' break. Unfortunately, my plans had to be abandoned and instead I had time to rest and recuperate at my family home in Edgware. The first week I knew I had to put my feet up. The second week I did NOTHING! One or two of you said to me on my return that they could not imagine that that was possible...it was and I enjoyed it! Someone else said to me 'Oh no...your batteries have been recharged!!!' It is good to be back, feeling so much better. Now we enter into the former schedule of Masses in all three churches. It is a crucial time for us to take stock, to keep everyone safe and to learn from these tumultuous months of agony while straining forward into the future. Of course, we want everything to be normal; the reality is not as straightforward. A priest-friend of mind, I discovered this week, has been afflicted by Covid; he is in isolation and has had to find ways of keeping his parish going. He told me on the phone that he had followed every rule to the letter and yet he caught it. We MUST take care.

We are now well and truly into November and a period of remembering. Today especially we recall the huge sacrifice of so many to preserve peace and uphold justice. We commend to God the dead of the Two World Wars and subsequent wars. We ask the Lord to comfort the bereaved. We pray for those who have been injured or bear the scars of warfare. We know that there are myriads whose lives are on the line for the sake of others. We REMEMBER and we PRAY. I had a chance to visit the graves of my Mum and Dad and other loved ones. It's a strange feeling seeing those names and reflecting on the passing years - so much to be grateful to God for and allowing the hope of faith to carry one forward.

In our Gospel reading, the last from St. Mark for a while, Jesus is very clear that we don't know when the end of time will come - only God the Father knows. There will be many signs AND more time. THEN he will come in glory! Don't worry. Trust with all your heart. Feel his presence so close to you.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.

SYNODAL PATHWAYS A number of parishioners have already responded. Please do so as soon as possible!

The Cardinal has asked us to prepare for the Synod of Bishops in 2023. 'The purpose of the synod is not to produce more documents. Rather it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.' (Vademecum 1.3)

We are asked to reflect on a series of questions:

During this terrible pandemic, what strengths did I find in my faith and faith community?

How, during this time, was I disappointed and sorrowful?

In what ways did the grace of God most clearly touch and uplift me?

Whom did we neglect the most?

Who feels left out?

What could we do better?

How do we choose priorities for our own mission?

The Pope does not only want us to share our thoughts with others; he wants us to sharpen our skill of listening to the other, thus developing our own understanding. I would ask you to take time this week to think hard about your response to these questions from Cardinal Vincent Nichols. Perhaps you might chat with family, friends or fellow parishioners? Why not jot down some of the fruits of your discussion and send them to Fr. Norbert?
