HOLY FAMILY

'What are you doing on Monday?' is a question I have put to a number of people in the last few days. Someone involved in Education said 'Starting to enjoy half-term'; some have stared at me blankly. Monday is Valentine's Day!!!! I have even asked innocent callers on the phone and one on Friday said straightaway 'Celebrating Valentine's Day!' I realise there is a strong commercial dimension with pressure to buy red roses (and all that!) but it is a way of expressing thanks for love received and given.

When we gather to celebrate Mass, we remember how much God loves humanity and the glorious creation which is the work of his hands. We reflect on God's journey with his Chosen People and how frailty, stubbornness and pride have distracted men and women from the right path. God has never given up on us and the sending of his Son is the pledge of his desire for us to be saved. We breathe in the power of God's Spirit shared with us in Jesus his Beloved Son and are caught up in the transformation of Bread and Wine into his Body and Blood - Sacrifice, Death and Resurrection are laid before us as we tell God how much we love this amazing Trinity of Persons. The very Presence of Jesus Christ at the heart of the Mass is humanity's response to the love of the Father. Sacrificial, eternal and undying love is the musical harmony ascending to God's Throne in heaven and returning to us with grace beyond measure.

In our Gospel reading today, St. Luke presents us with the 'Sermon on the Plain'. Jesus comes to a level place to be so close to a whole variety of humanity: the Twelve, his disciples and a huge crowd of people from all sorts of places. He is concerned for every single person and he is not afraid to challenge those who need to be kicked into action as well as affirming the lowly and disregarded. He looks each one of us in the eye and has a word to utter personally to us. Listening and pondering the message, as well as responding are hallmarks of the love a disciple has for the Lord who is the Father's greatest gift to us.

The Bishops intend to build upon this work over the coming year that we may creatively celebrate our diversity and shared humanity.

OUR CHURCHES WITH THE NEW REGULATIONS

The Bishops' Conference has given the go-ahead for parishes to return to 'normal'. Some churches have done so already. Here in our three churches, we will do so from the weekend of 26th/27th February:

Mass books and hymn books will be in use. Printed newsletter every week.

Holy Water will be in the stoups as you enter church. However, we will ensure that at the end of each Mass the stoups will be emptied, wiped clean and fresh Holy Water put in for the next congregation.

Benches will not be blocked off.

Votive candles will be available to light at the stands.

Altar Servers will start up again at the end of February. They should let Fr. Norbert know as soon as possible if they plan to return to serve, that they have albs which fit and be ready to come half an hour earlier to run through serving with the priest for the first couple of weekends. Once the established servers are back in action, new servers can be enrolled.

Holy Communion to the Sick and the housebound will be possible. Again, please let Fr. Norbert know soon and the format of how it happens from Mass will be outlined. Holy Communion Priests and Eucharistic Ministers will continue to wear masks and sanitise their hands for the distribution of Holy Communion. It is really good practice for those receiving Holy Communion to do so before they leave the priest or the Eucharistic Minister.

Chapel at Our Lady's will be open once more for quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Norbert will open it at 7am and close at 6pm.

Teas and coffees on Sundays and weekdays will be possible following the pattern from before the pandemic. Good hygiene will be crucial. Those who would like to offer this hospitality should let Fr. Norbert know.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION All First Communion families should receive information about the preparation and dates this weekend, preparation books are being posted next week. Confirmation families will be emailed this week with dates and other information. If you haven't yet sent in forms which are on parish website, it's not too late. Please do so as soon as possible!

ADULTS WHO WISH TO JOIN THE CHURCH (RCIA) If anyone is interested in joining the Catholic Church or is an adult who missed out on Confirmation when younger, please contact Fr. Norbert on 01707 323234 and he will organise preparation directly with you. We are still aiming to celebrate the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil (Saturday 16th April)

MARRIAGE PREPARATION There will not be a face-to-face preparation day this year. However, any couples wanting to marry this year or next either in WGC or elsewhere should contact Fr. Norbert to organise the paperwork and the Marriage Course. Thank you. Valentine's Day is imminent!!

BAPTISMS Please contact Fr. Norbert or Fr. William if you wish to arrange the Baptism of your child and they will organise all that is needed.

SYNODAL PATHWAYS All the responses which came in over the last few months have been sent to the Diocese. Fr. Norbert is grateful for these. In due course when we are in our new hall, there will be a continuation of some of the themes raised and a moving forward together.
