Second Sunday of Lent 13th March 2022

Lent is moving fast and our lives are all over the place as we think about all that is happening in the Ukraine with suffering, tears, hunger and devastation. In some ways it impinges on us as did the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic when we were glued to the television watching all that was unfolding, seeing the amazing front-line workers bringing support to those who were sick and feeling quite helpless as to what to do. At the start there was such terror and fear about the coronavirus - who had it or would next be struck by it. As we take in the full impact of the situation in the east of our continent, we can't help but consider the prospect of war, maybe even world war; the use of weapons of destruction would wreak havoc untold and leave long-lasting trauma. As well as the material support which can - and is - being given, we are praying fervently, begging God to pour out his Holy Spirit in torrents which can lavish grace, healing and peace, moving hearts and minds to work beyond barriers which seen insurmountable. Our prayer is based on a deep trust in God and is a sign of our solidarity with the suffering; it expresses our total dependence on God when we can't achieve things on our own.

In our Gospel reading from St. Luke proclaimed at Mass, we see Jesus in deep prayer on a mountain accompanied by a few disciples. He is one with his Father and his whole being radiates the divine: his face changes and his clothing is brilliant as lightning. What a transformation/transfiguration! St. Luke tells us that he talks with Moses and Elijah about his passing - exodus - and we cannot help but remember the powerful experience the people of Israel leaving slavery and tears in Egypt and travelling for 40 long years through the wilderness to the Promised Land - their home! Jesus' awareness of what occurs on that mountain prepares him for the long journey towards Jerusalem and eventual Death and Resurrection. The Church gives us Lent to get ready, to be in training and embark on the final pathway to the Cross knowing that we are intimately connected with God's Son and the destination of heaven. He is our hope, our light and our salvation.

Let us be people of prayer and generous followers of Christ. May God bless you. With love and prayers, *Fr. Norbert*

SERVICE OF RECONCILIATION on Tuesday 12th April at 8pm in Our Lady's. It has been ages since we've been able to gather in this way. There will be reflection on Scripture for about 10 minutes and then 3 visiting priests will join Fr. Norbert and Fr. William to hear Confessions. There's time to stop, think and ponder, time to make your Confession and experience the riches of God's mercy in this sacramental way AND the opportunity to go to a priest you do not know (if you prefer)! People leave once they have gone to the priest for Confession. Put the date in your diary. Parents bring your children. Let's avail of this moment in Holy Week to feel the closeness of the Lord to us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
